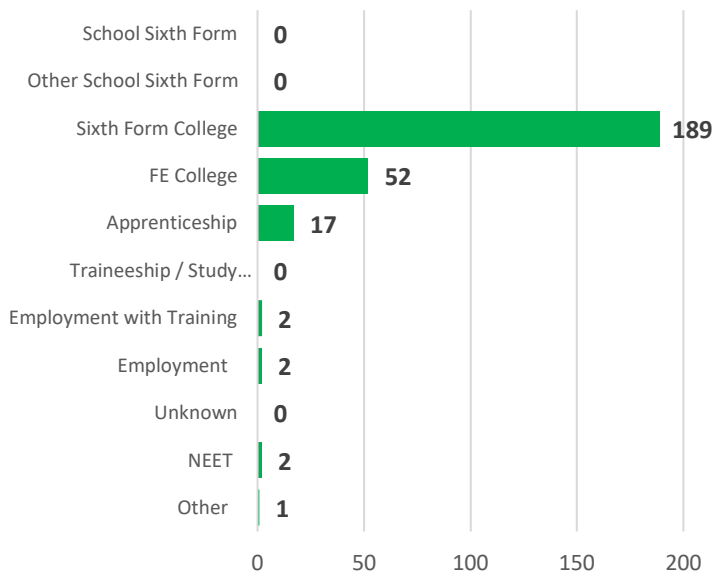
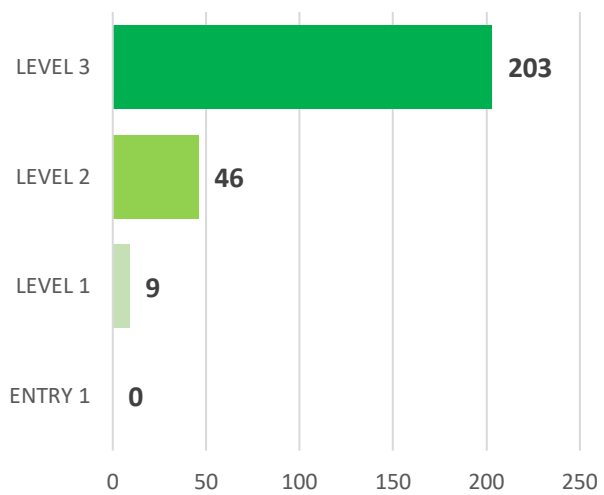


OCTOBER ACTIVITY SURVEY - DESTINATIONS


2018 – 2019 57.8% (153 students) in Y11 achieved a Grade 5 + in English and Maths enabling them to progress into Level 3 courses at Sixth Form and Further Education Colleges.

6% (17 students) were successful in securing an Apprenticeship.

1% (2 students) were reported Not in Education Employment or Training. **2% (4 students)** have secured employment but only 2 have secured employment with accredited training.

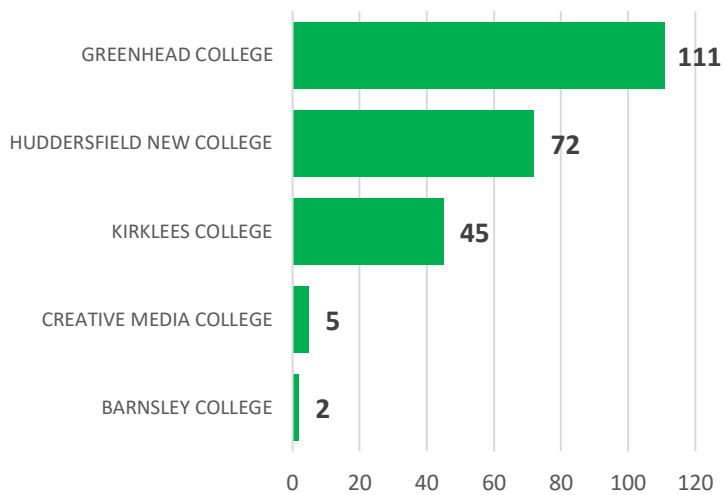
QUALIFICATION LEVELS


2018 – 2019 - Total number of Y11 students - 265

- 77% (203 students) progressed onto L3 courses
- 17% (46 students) progressed onto L2 courses
- 3% (9 students) progressed onto L1 courses

Numbers not included in the above are the following

- 1% (2 students) entered Employment with training as training level unknown
- 1% (2 students) in Employment without training
- 1% (2 NEET)
- 1% (1 student) Other – is Army unsure of training level

PROVIDER DETAILS


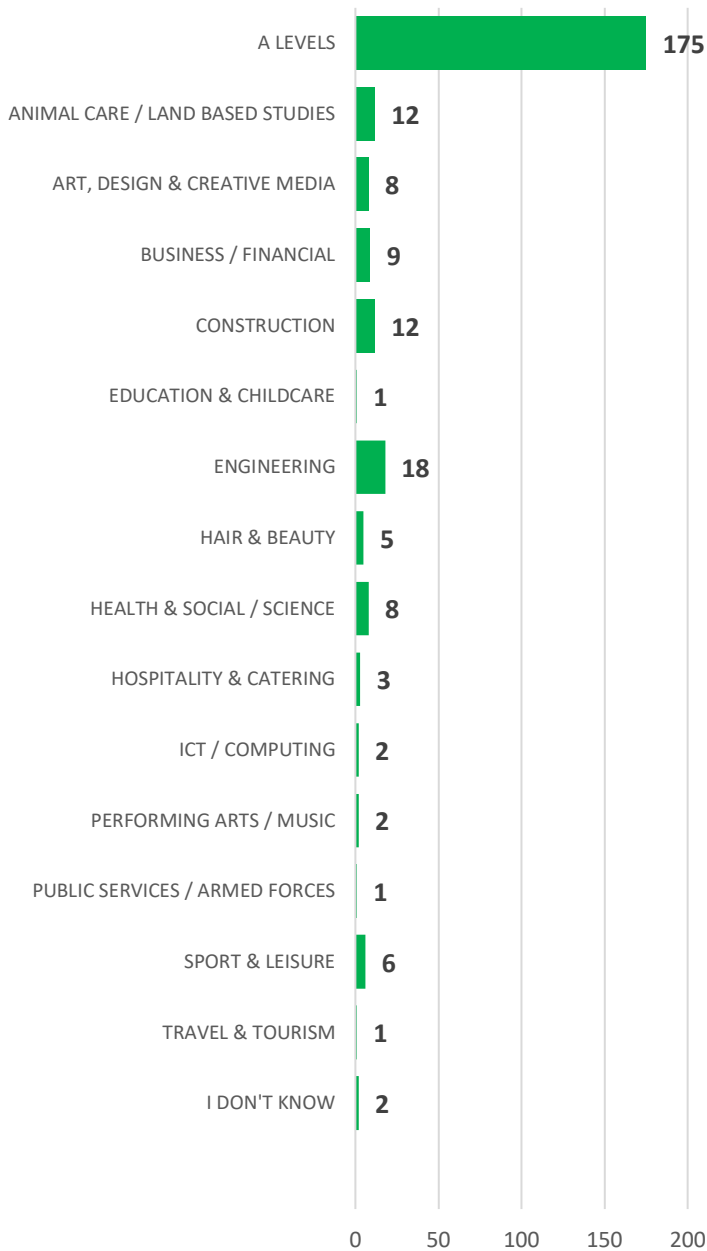
2018 – 2019

Greenhead College is the preferred Sixth Form provider in the area with **42% (111 students)** progressed onto A level study. This is representative of the student aspiration and desire to obtain A levels from a high performing P16 provider.

27% (72 students) progressed onto Level 3 courses including A levels and BTEC Lvl 3 courses at Huddersfield New College

Kirklees College is still the preferred Vocational Course Provider with **17% (45 students)** enrolling there.

SECTOR DETAILS



A Levels – 66% of Y11 progressed onto A level study at a sixth from college.

4.5% progressed onto courses related to Animal Care and another 4.5% progressed onto Construction

Engineering – 7% (18 students) progressed onto courses related to engineering. This includes Motor Vehicle Technology, Mechanical and Electrical engineering.

3.5% of students progressed onto **Art, Design and Creative Media** courses and a further 3.5% progressed onto **Health & Social / Science** related courses

Other sectors such as **Travel and Tourism, ICT, Performing Arts, Hospitality and Catering and Public Services** all saw 1% of students progressing onto these vocational areas.

HEADLINES

Engineering, Animal and Land based, Construction and Health and Social Care continue to be preferred areas of interest based on Local and Regional Labour Market Information.

Apprenticeships have always had a low number of students progressing onto these with average numbers of about 7-9 students. However, Holmfirth High School have a high number of those progressing onto Apprenticeships with 17 students in total.

Consistent choice of P16 providers demonstrates that geographical location may have impact on student destinations. Transport links to other P16 providers such as Kirklees college, Greenhead College and New College Huddersfield
